Public Information Act Schedule of Fees

The Maryland Public Information Act provides that a custodian may charge an applicant a reasonable fee for the search, for preparation of, and reproduction of a public record. A "reasonable fee" means a fee bearing a reasonable relationship to the recovery of actual costs by a governmental unit.

Two hours of time for search and preparation of a public record for inspection are provided without charge. The applicant will be charged for additional time as follows:

Staff of the Engineering, Inspections & Construction Department,Operations & Maintenance Department, Fiscal, Billing &Procurement Department, IT Department, Human Resources,\$30.00 / hourAdministration & Board of Commissioners

Photocopies: \$.20 per page

For larger copies, charges are as follows per page:

Black & White: 24" x 36" @ \$ 1.20 36" x 48" @ \$ 1.60 Color: 24" x 36" @ \$ 2.40 36" x 48" @ \$ 3.20

For requests that will require a substantial amount of time for search, preparation, or supervised inspection, an estimate of fees will be prepared beginning the search, and a deposit may be required.
